ORDER

The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) & Chief Wildlife Warden, in his letter read above has submitted a proposal received from Smt. Uma Ramakrishnan, Assistant Professor, National Centre for Biological Science, Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, GKVK Campus, Bellary Road, Bangalore requesting permission to collect blood and buccal swabs from 17 species of birds for scientific Research titled "Examining connectivity of protected areas in the Western and Eastern Ghats of Kerala suggesting potential corridors". The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) & Chief Wildlife Warden has recommended the proposal to grant permission to Smt. Uma Ramakrishnan and three other researchers for the above purpose.

Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to grant permission to Smt. Uma Ramakrishnan, Assistant Professor, Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Bangalore and three other researchers to collect blood and buccal swabs of the following 17 species of birds at the following nine locations for Scientific Research titled "Examining connectivity of protected areas in the Western and Eastern Ghats of Kerala and suggesting potential corridors". The period of study will be from July 2011 to September, 2015.


