ORDER

As per letter read as 1st paper above, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has informed that the financial cycle of the ASUMP Scheme concluded on 31 March 2026 and since some funds remained un-utilised, with the approval of Department of Expenditure, the scheme has been extended for a period of six months, i.e. till 30.09.2026 and has also requested to submit action plan proposals under the scheme. Accordingly the State Level Empowered Committee (SLEC) Meeting held on 20.04.2026 approved the proposal submitted by the State Police Chief and forwarded the approved minutes alongwith the proposal to the Ministry.

2) As per the minutes read as 4th paper above, the Ministry of Home Affairs in its High Powered Committee (HPC) meeting held on 18.05.2026 has considered the Action Plan proposal for the financial year 2026-27 under the scheme ASUMP and approved the proposal subject to certain conditions.

3) Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to accord Administrative Sanction for an amount of Rs. 28107.77 Lakh (Rupees Two Hundred Eighty One Crore Seven Lakh and Seventy Seven Thousand Only) for the implementation of the State Action Plan as follows for the financial year 2026-27 under the scheme ASUMP as approved by the Ministry of Home Affairs in its High Powered Committee meeting held on 18.05.2026.

The DCPW has informed that after detailed deliberation, the revised proposal of Rs. 59,79,55,000/- submitted by the State was reexamined and recommended the proposal with advice to initiate procurement through GeM along with Reverse Auction provision for better price reasonability. Additionally DCPW also suggested that Kerala Police may deploy Polnet 2.0 VSAT Satellite Terminals at their all Police District HQs including Police HQ to facilitate all weather-proof seamless inter-Police district Voice, Data and Video Communication services including with Police HQ.

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The State Police Chief shall also follow the conditions stipulated in the minutes of the High Powered Committee of MHA in its meeting held on 18.05.2026 as given below:

- a. No brand names were recommended or approved by the Committee.
- b. The items which are available on GeM portal are to be mandatorily purchased through GeM and reasonability of rates is to be ensured by the

procuring entity.

c. As far as possible, indigenously manufactured equipment/products should be accorded priority. Hence, public procurement (Purchase of Make in India) order issued by Govt. of India, as modified from time to time should be scrupulously complied with. Also, Police Department must engage in consultations with CAPFs for such purpose and even tagging of procurements of weapons and other equipment wherever possible to take advantage of the discounts obtained due to aggregating orders of both CAPFs and States.

d. All the codal formalities as per the GFR, 2017, as modified from time to time, are to be strictly adhered to.

e. The concerned SOP/QRs/Specifications/TDs/other directives of MHA/DCPW and other such organisation for procurement of Communication equipment/other equipment should be adhered to.

f. For procurement of drones and related items, Government of India guidelines may be referred to.

g. Police Department is requested to expedite procurement and utilize funds as per earlier approvals as has been reiterated in various meetings held in MHA.

h. Regular monitoring of the funds/projects may be done by the senior level officers and monthly progress report of the funds/project may be submitted to the Ministry.

i. Police Department is requested to complete the projects before 31st Dec 2026 with preparedness to bear the corresponding State share as per the applicable funding pattern.

j. The State Police Chief shall prioritize components initially for about half of the considered amount and the remaining half could be taken up subject to availability of unutilized outlay after approving plans of other states in about 2-3 months time.

k. The Police Department is advised to initiate procurement of the components under "Communication" through GeM along with Reverse Auction provision for better price reasonability.

l. Drones to be procured must be compliant with Drone Rules 2021 and in terms of the MHA approved QR & TDs only. For the same the Police Department shall re-examine its functional and operational requirements in consultation with BSF. Also the number of drones shall be reduced and procure relevant category drones.

m. In place of item 'Laptops for Scientific Staffs' and 'high end laptops' specified under the "Forensic" category, 141 'Workstations' shall be procured.

n. Cost of item 'High Intensity Narrow Band Forensic Light Source' specified under the "Forensic Head" seems to be on the higher side, so the cost shall be reassessed.

o. For Special Purpose Vehicles, the components shall be taken up in 2 tranches. As the total component is of about Rs. 50 Crores, approximately Rs. 20 Cr worth procurement is directed to be taken up in the first instance and remaining Rs. 30 Cr worth vehicles in the second phase after consultation with MHA for availability of outlay. In addition, plan for phasing out old vehicles shall be submitted to the MHA.
