**ORDER**

As per the letters read above, the Member Secretary, Kerala State Biodiversity Board, the Director, Environment & Climate Change, Member Secretary, Kerala State Pollution Control Board and Chief Resilience Officer, Office of Kerala State Climate Change Adaptation Mission have submitted proposals for according Administrative Sanction under Annual Plan 2024-25 for implementation of Plan Schemes by utilizing current year's budget provision.

2) The Departmental Working Group of Environment Department held on 16.04.2024 scrutinized the proposals in detail and recommended the following schemes for Administrative Sanction as detailed in the minutes read above, subject to specific conditions. 3) Having considered the above proposals in detail, Government are pleased to accord Administrative Sanction to the Directorate of Environment & Climate Change, Kerala State Biodiversity Board, Kerala State Pollution Control Board and Kerala State Climate Change Adaptation Mission for implementation of the above projects as recommended by the Working Group for a total amount of **Rs.831.47 Lakh (Rupees Eight Hundred Thirty One Lakh Forty Seven Thousand only)**, **Rs.1050 Lakh (Rupees One Thousand Fifty Lakh only)**, **Rs.300 Lakh (Rupees Three Hundred Lakh only)** and **Rs. 100 Lakhs (Rupees One Hundred Lakhs Only)** respectively by debiting the expenditure from the respective head of accounts during the year 2024-25.

4) The Director, Environment & Climate Change, Member Secretary, Kerala State Biodiversity Board, Member Secretary, Kerala State Pollution Control Board and Chief Resilience Officer, Kerala State Climate Change Adaptation Mission will strictly monitor the implementation of plan schemes at each stage and they will furnish physical and financial progress reports to Government before 10<sup>th</sup> of every month.

5) The above sanction is subject to the following further conditions :

- (i) Tender/e-tender and other required formalities shall be followed wherever necessary.
- (ii) Stores Purchase Rules shall be strictly adhered to.
- (iii) For civil works PWD schedule of rates shall be followed.
- (iv) Hiring of vehicle must be done after prior approval from Finance Department.
- (v) Regarding the continuation of the daily/contract staff prior approval of Government should be obtained.
- (vi) The funds releasing will be based on actual requirement.
